What is Good Friday and why are we gathered here? It is a day of contradictions, to be sure. Now is the "acceptable time" of which Paul spoke in 2 Corinthians 6:2. We are always dying and rising to new life, but especially on this day. We are all the actors in this story: the people shouting "Crucify him!" and the women who stand vigil at the foot of the cross, the soldiers who cast lots for his tunic and Joseph of Arimathea who gave his own tomb for Jesus' burial. Today we lament the pain of this world and we face our complicity in that pain; we seek to be witnesses to--and participants in--God's power over the evil of this world. Now is the acceptable time – the time when Christ's death sets us free to choose life.

On this Good Friday, we contemplate the good news of the cross: how Christ our Lord stretched out his arms to embrace a world of suffering and sin; how Christ our Lord stretched out his arms to save us.
