The First Lesson

Colossians 3:12-17

New Testament

12 As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. 13 Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. 14 Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. 15 And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. 16 Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. 17 And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

The Second Lesson

1 Corinthians 13:1-13

New Testament

1 If I speak in the tongues of mortals and of angels, but do not have love, I am a noisy gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 And if I have prophetic powers, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have all faith, so as to remove mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing.
3 If I give away all my possessions, and if I hand over my body so that I may

boast, but do not have love, I gain nothing.

4 Love is patient; love is kind; love is not envious or boastful or arrogant 5 or rude. It does not insist on its own way; it is not irritable or resentful; 6 it does not rejoice in wrongdoing, but rejoices in the truth.

7 It bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

8 Love never ends. But as for prophecies, they will come to an end; as for tongues, they will cease; as for knowledge, it will come to an end.

9 For we know only in part, and we prophesy only in part; 10 but when the complete comes, the partial will come to an end. 11 When I was a child, I spoke like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child; when I became an adult, I put an end to childish ways. 12 For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known. 13 And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

Renewal of Vows

Let us reaffirm now the promises made in marriage, knowing that your grace will always be sufficient. By the power of your Holy Spirit, bless our memories and strengthen our hopes, that our joy may overflow.

I will continue to share the journey of life with you in faith and in hope, with God's help. In word and in deed, may my commitment serve as a sign of our love, reaffirmed in tender hope for what lies ahead; in the name of God, whose steadfast love endures forever.

Prayers of the People

Eternal God, without your grace no promise is sure. Strengthen all couples with patience, kindness, gentleness, and all other gifts of your Spirit, so that they may fulfill the vows they have made. Keep them faithful to each other and to you. Fill them with such love and joy that they may build a home of peace and welcome. Guide them by your word to serve you all their days.

And enable us all, O God, in each of our homes and lives to do your will. Enrich us with your grace so that, encouraging and supporting one another, we may serve those in need and hasten the coming of peace, love, and justice on earth.

Lord, our God, wherever we live, we need you. Wherever we live, you call us to serve you. We pray for those who are single, whether it be by choice or circumstance, and for those who live alone, especially now, as quarantine precautions have complicated relationships and distanced family members and friends from one another.

We pray that you will provide for all of your children - those among us and those around us - homes of shelter and safety, communities of loving encouragement and support, opportunities to live as faithful disciples of Jesus and ministers of Christ's peace. **Amen.**
