Pastor's Corner

### Friends,

Throughout my ministry, it has been important to me to reach out to those who are isolated. Now, more than ever, large numbers of individuals are isolated - cut off from friends, family, church, and other activities that bring them joy and enliven their spirits. The suspension of in-person worship services, along with other, in-person gatherings at Westminster has been both lengthy and challenging for all of us. Yet, even in the midst of a global pandemic, we have found new ways to be the church.

I am grateful that many of you have engaged with our community virtually. You are taking advantage of audio and visual advancements to participate in online worship, Bible studies, discussion groups, and committee meetings. The food collections we previously enjoyed as a part of the regular worship experience in the church sanctuary have shifted outside to the parking lot.

Amid trying times, you continue to find creative ways to carry on as the body of Christ. Thus, while our Session has chosen to suspend in-person worship through the end of August with my full support, we all understand that the church was never actually "closed." Rather, the church simply adapted and evolved, just as it has been doing for the last two millennia.

Even so, not all were equally prepared for the changes we are now experiencing. A number of our members do not own a computer, do not use email, and do not otherwise have access to our virtual worship services. For them, the current challenges are not merely an inconvenience but are the difference between living in community and feeling totally cut off from it. Recently, I had the pleasure of speaking with Mary Johnson on the day of her 69th wedding anniversary. Less than two weeks earlier, she had celebrated her 88th birthday. She and Herb are doing well, physically, but living in daily isolation is not how they imagined spending their golden years.

Human beings are social creatures and we long for life in community. To this end, our Session continues to monitor the safety and security issues related to resuming a variety of in-person activities. Presently, groups of up to ten people are permitted to gather on church grounds by observing social distancing precautions, agreeing to mask, and utilizing hand sanitizing stations. Additionally, our staff is available to you from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Monday - Friday. Please continue to reach out to fellow members who may be feeling isolated. Your positive interaction serves as a hopeful reminder of the enduring nature of the body of Christ.

# **New Membership & Accounting Software**

ACS software was developed over 35 years ago. Westminster began using ACS in mid-2012. Over a year ago, ACS developed a new more technological and mobile based software titled Realm. They are in the process of moving their clients to the more mobile system with the intent of replacing the current ACS software.

There are several levels of Realm based on the user. Realm Inform is for churches with less than 200 in weekly worship attendance and is designed for use by church staff. Reviews on the new software indicate that it is easier to use and it is less expensive. WPC anticipates savings of \$2,500 or more per year in software support charges after the upgrade. Session approved the software upgrade at its meeting on May 26, 2020.

In preparation for the upgrade, WPC staff, Finance Committee and Membership Committee recognized that our membership and accounting databases were in dire need of "cleanup" before the conversion. The Membership Committee established some basic rules for the clean-up procedure and new "member" categories were established. Beginning June 1, staff began the process of reviewing nearly 3,000 records to identify those that should be carried into the new software and update information about our current church family. The conversion is tentatively scheduled for the week of August 10. During that week, we will be unable to access the database or accounting records until the data conversion and upgrade is complete. Staff will participate in a five-hour web training program to introduce them to the new features available and teach them to utilize the new software.

Please be patient as we all learn a new system. I can guarantee that reports and other information will need adjustments and refinement before they are just perfect!

# **An Unexpected Diagnosis**

Hello friends. Because I am a visible part of the Ministry Team here I need to explain some of my behavior that is seen when I am speaking sometimes now. I was diagnosed in May of 2017 with Parkinson's Disease. Parkinson's Disease (PD) is a chronic and progressive movement disorder that involves the malfunction and death of vital nerve cells in the brain, called neurons. Some of these dying neurons once produced dopamine, a chemical that sends messages to the part of the brain that controls movement and coordination. As PD progresses, the amount of dopamine produced in the brain decreases, leaving a person unable to control movement normally.

It is very tricky to get the dosage right. I need to have enough to help loosen the rigidity that comes with the lack of natural dopamine and not too much that gives my body uncontrolled movements. You may see some of that right now as the disease progresses and we are always tinkering with medications. There are also many other symptoms of Parkinson's that just show up! Never a dull moment with this unpredictable disease. The positive news is that there is a LOT of research going on! I am actually in a year long trial with the Cleveland Clinic looking at exercise and PD. I am thrilled to be using a Peloton bike in my home (provided by the study). They are looking at exercise intensity. It is clear that exercise helps the symptoms of PD, but they are now trying to zero in on just what kinds of exercise work in what ways and the medicines that work with the exercise. I just started on June 29 and I am hoping for some improvement in my symptoms.

So, I just would like to be transparent with this part of my life, I would like to continue to serve Westminster as long as I am useful. I don't want your sympathy (there are worse diseases!), but I DO appreciate your prayers. And I continue to pray for all of you as we navigate this frightful pandemic.

current system. Early on we learned that the speakers were not providing sound to the back half of the Sanctuary. We also discovered that some of the speakers had been disconnected. Much to our surprise, one of the technicians referred to us was involved with the original quotes to install the current system. He remembered the Sanctuary very well and noticed that the rear Sanctuary speakers were directing sound to the balcony rather than to the rear of the Sanctuary on the main floor.

Session hired RNR Systems, Inc., to check all of the wiring and components of the sound system. All of the equipment was found to be working properly, and after rewiring some connections in the lower level sound room, the sound in the Sanctuary improved significantly. To complete the project, RNR Systems, Inc., will rehang the rear speakers to match the angle called for in the original specifications; meet with WPC Sound Board Operators to make final adjustments; and provide any training needed to keep the system working at its optimum. All of this was accomplished at a cost of less than \$5,500. We hope you are pleased with the improved sound in the Sanctuary.

# What Is Happening With Properties

Since mid-March few have been to the church. Thank you for staying home and being safe. Properties Committee has been meeting, via Zoom, to keep things going. Here is our update.

- WYDACA started back on June 1. The number of children has been reduced due to covid-19 restrictions. We are happy they are able to provide this much needed service.
