The Salvation Army has funding concerns for this Christmas season as they expect low kettle contributions due to the pandemic. Family Sunday

Family Sunday will take place on December 20, the Fourth Sunday of Advent, and will feature our annual Christmas pageant (pre-recorded in small groups), along with a child liturgist.

The lighting of the Advent candles will continue this year, utilizing worship team leaders as Advent candle lighters. As a result of Covid-19 precautions, we will not be incorporating the Paragon brass quintet on Christmas Eve and will be providing alternative forms of worshiping God through music.



The Third Sunday Dinner

Third Sunday Dinner Crew reopened on August 16th for the first time in several months and again provided hot meals to the community in September. Following social distance protocols and using a drive-through service, Akron community members were able to pick-up a hot meal prepared by WPC's outstanding chefs: Mike Grau, Anne Karney and Raphael Peoples. Several other volunteers helped to make this service possible including help in the kitchen, running food to the pick up point and distributing meals. Left over meals were given to Haven of Rest Ministries. We continue to need members to consider signing up to wash dishes or pass out meals. Drive-In/Drop-Off Food Collection

Thanks to your generosity, the Outreach Committee with the help of the Tweens and Youth has received and packed over 100 bags of groceries. Distributions have benefitted Good Neighbors, those who come to the church during the hours of distribution, and a



food pantry located on North Hawkins that serves an area of disabled and low-income households. Collections are scheduled for Sunday, November 1 and Sunday, December 6 from 1:00 to 2:30 p.m. Thank you for your generosity!

We continue to have many opportunities to share our talents, time, and gifts with our shared community of faith, the greater Akron community, and on behalf of the national and international work of the church.



Information to Know

Pastoral Portraits Unveiling

On October 11, three pastoral portraits were unveiled during our online worship service by Elder Michael Dunbar. One reminds us of a difficult past, while two others proclaim that God is not done with us yet. Together, we continue to wrestle with the challenges and triumphs of our shared history.

The first pastoral portrait we unveiled is of Bill Markley. Markley arrived at Westminster in 1992. From his sermons to his leadership style, Markley was a divider. His pastorate here was brief and, as a direct result of his words and deeds, our congregation endured a very painful schism. Consequently, Markley lost his ordination status in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).



Today, we are aggrieved by the pain caused by Bill Markley, and for the wounds that remain. We also recognize that remembering the past does not mean honoring each actor in it. Sometimes it is, instead, a call for repentance. By including Markley's portrait among the other pastoral leaders of this church, we are affirming our commitment to the healing and wholeness embodied by Jesus on behalf of the one body of Christ.

Following Markley's tumultuous time at Westminster, capable pastors served this congregation with their care, concern, and skill.

They attempted to heal wounds and to move the church forward. The second pastoral portrait that we unveiled is of The Reverend Dr. Clifford Hayes. Dr. Hayes, who served our congregation from 1997 - 2004, was a healer in almost every respect.

He was particularly gifted at ministering to others in one-on-one settings. During his pastorate, Westminster rallied around the effort to rebuild the organ, and embarked on a renovation of what would become known as Wright-Herberich Hall. Dr. Hayes' ministry is a powerful legacy of the endurance and fortitude of the people of God.

The third pastoral portrait that we unveiled is of The Reverend Derek Starr Redwine. The Reverend Starr Redwine was an energetic organizer who was eager to experiment with new approaches. As a result, he was instrumental in beginning numerous new ministries in the life of this congregation.

In time, Derek was joined on staff by his wife, Amy, also an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), who served as Westminster's Associate Pastor. Together, they were a dynamic team, making friends easily and engaging in inter-generational ministry.

Friends and fellow believers in Christ, this is a brief snapshot of where we have been. Today we not only remember and reflect on a difficult past, but also joyfully celebrate what God has accomplished among us.

Seeking to be ever-faithful to the leading of God's Spirit, and striving forward to what lies ahead, let us give thanks for the ministry of Westminster Presbyterian Church that carries on in us. And, together, may we embrace a future that even now is being revealed.

A Letter from Cathy Ulrich

Dear Saints of Westminster,

On behalf of Eastminster Presbytery, I bring you greetings and give thanks for your faithfulness during this time of pandemic. Westminster continues to shine the light of Jesus Christ into dark and lonely places. I am humbled to call you my friends.

Today is an extraordinary example of how Westminster understands God's grace. Your ability to name your past and honor it for its strengths while recognizing its weakness, is a profound act of faith in a loving God. This also calls the presbytery to acknowledge its role in the life of the church. The portrait of each pastor represents a season of ministry in which the presbytery was a partner. Each pastor was elected by the congregation and the presbytery and the congregation may not call a pastor without the support of the presbytery. On behalf of Eastminster Presbytery, I offer sincere apology to Westminster for the mistakes, misunderstandings, and errors committed by the presbytery. There are times the presbytery fails, and the church suffers. Congregations, presbyteries, and pastors are all fallible human beings who seek to do the will of God. Pastoral relationships are established with prayer, discernment, vows of commitment, and the expectation that we are following the will of God. In each of these, we are deeply in need of the saving grace of Jesus Christ. The truth affirmed today is that though there is a portrait hung that many would see as a dark time in the life of the church, there are two others which represent seasons of healing and fruitful ministry. My guess is that a review of all the portraits which hang in your church would reveal that pain and disappointment are present in each ministry, and that the memories of grace and blessing outnumber the times of pain.

The truth you represent today is that the light of Christ shines through us; it shines on the pain, it shines on the blessing, it shines on the ordinary. May these portraits be a reminder that, in season and out of season, we are known by God, and we are each called God's beloved.

Thank you for your faithfulness and your courage. May the Spirit of Christ continue to surround you and lead you as you seek to serve Almighty God.
