Freezer

Approximately 15 years ago, Westminster purchased a large freezer which is presently located in the flower room. At the time of purchase, the freezer was used. Over the years, it has been serviced and repaired numerous times. Sadly, the time has now come to say farewell to it. While purchasing a replacement is a possibility at some future date, there are no immediate plans to replace this equipment. Per Session action, Third Sunday Dinners will now be held quarterly rather than monthly and, on account of the pandemic, we have not been hosting large fellowship gatherings for the last couple of years. Be assured that the Properties Committee will continue to monitor our needs in this area.

Steeple

Our Session has contracted with Frost Restoration to return our steeple to its original glory. Our intention was to begin this project in the summer of 2021. Unfortunately, material and labor shortages have persisted in many industries. These issues are now impacting our project, which will not be completed this year. During the fall and winter, the materials will be purchased and warehoused so that we will not run into this issue again. In the spring of 2022, scaffolding will be added to the exterior of our facility in preparation for the work to commence in May. We recognize that the steeple is in need of attention. Thankfully, this is an aesthetic issue more than one related to the functionality of our property. We are not presently aware of any leaks, and we do not anticipate any damage as a result of the wait. Thank you for your patience and understanding.
