Second Lesson Acts 8:26-31 and 35-38 New Testament

26 Then an angel of the Lord said to Philip, "Get up and go toward the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza." (This is a wilderness road.) 27 So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury. He had come to Jerusalem to worship

- 28 and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah.
- 29 Then the Spirit said to Philip, "Go over to this chariot and join it."
- 30 So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, "Do you understand what you are reading?"
- 31 He replied, "How can I, unless someone guides me?" And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him.
- 35 Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus.

Finance Committee Notes - July 31, 2021

Pledged Gifts - \$22,500 in prepayments paid in 2021 Nonpledged Gifts - \$22,200 from households that already fulfilled 2021 pledge commitment.

Endowment Distributions – received \$7,265 more than budgeted. Expenses are below average but beginning to increase with fall program staffing and expenses.
