<u>Reader 1</u>: As the Advent Candles of hope, peace, joy, and love shine among us, we gather this evening to celebrate the birth of the Christ Child.

Reader 2: In Him, God's Word became flesh and lived among us.

<u>Reader 1</u>: In Him, God's Love became flesh and embraced all humanity. <u>Reader 2</u>: In Him, God's Light became flesh and illumined the world.

<u>People</u>: The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness — on them light has shined. (Isaiah 9:2)

*Affirmation of Faith

from A Declaration of Faith

Jesus, the long expected deliverer, came into the world as a child, descended from David, conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of Mary, a virgin. He lived as a Jew among Jews. He announced to his people the coming of God's kingdom of justice and peace on earth. We affirm that Jesus was born of woman as is every child, yet born of God's power as was no other child. In the person and work of Jesus, God and a human life are united but not confused, distinguished but not separated. The coming of Jesus was itself the coming of God's promised rule. Through his birth, life, death, and

resurrection, Jesus brings about the relationship between God and humanity that God always intended.

Prayers of the People, Silent Reflection and The Lord's Prayer

Loving God, who inaugurates a new day for all people upon the planet through the birth of Your Son, as we bow together in prayer, grant that the glad glow of Christmas would not diminish . . . that the spirit of good will would not fade . . . and that the message from the manger would be kept alive. May "joy to the world" forever be understood, so that all the good and blessed things of Christmas would become a significant part of every day of the year.
