Reader 1: Having lit the candle of hope, we anticipate a new reality for all humanity; and having lit the candle of peace, we look forward to the day when swords will be refashioned into plowshares, and no one will learn war anymore.

Reader 2: During Advent, we acknowledge that the signs of God's kingdom are being revealed among us, and we commit ourselves to the proclamation of the good news of great joy, so that we will not allow our preparations to push joy from our lives.

Reader 1: This morning we light the candle of joy because we celebrate our identity as God's beloved children.

Reader 2: We light this candle to accentuate that God's promised Deliverer will bring the gift of a new life and impart true and everlasting joy to all people. (light the candle)

Reader 1: Joy is God's melody amid the discord of life. Through this chorus that renews all creation, we anticipate the music of God's newness.

The Lord be with you. **And also with you.**Lift up your hearts! **We lift them to the Lord.**Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

It is truly right and our greatest joy to give You thanks and praise, eternal God, our Creator, for just as the light from the Advent candles seeks to dispel the darkness of chaos, You illumine our paths through the bright and Morning Star of Your grace. Shine Your light upon the paths of our sisters and brothers, and gather all of us together so that we may join our voices with the choirs of heaven and with all the faithful of every time and place in praising You and singing to the glory of Your name:

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of Your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

You are holy, O God of majesty, and blessed is Jesus Christ, Your Son, our Lord, who healed and taught, challenged and comforted, welcomed and saved, forming a community of faith, and bidding His disciples to continue His mission of hope and healing in the world. Even when He was betrayed by those closest to Him, He continued to love all people, refusing to return evil for evil, and giving His life so that the world could be set free from suffering and sin. Through Your power, O God, You raised Jesus from the dead, and we ask that You would fashion our lives into a holy and living sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving, so that we may boldly and faithfully proclaim the mystery of faith:

Christ has died, Christ is risen, Christ will come again.

Gracious God, in these holy moments pour out Your Holy Spirit upon those of us gathered here and upon the gifts which grace this sacred table. Nourish us through the broken bread that can reshape our fragmented lives into instruments that serve You faithfully; and as we partake of Your cup of grace, grant that we may be renewed to lead all people to the joy that flows from the wells of Your salvation. Unite us now at Your table, and through sharing one loaf and a common cup, make us one in Christ Jesus so that our life of faith would ignite our witness in the world. Through this Eucharistic celebration, inspire us to welcome all people as You have welcomed us, so that we may not only embrace the neighbor and the newcomer, the resident and the refugee, the persecuted and the impoverished, but we would also discover what they have to teach us, through Jesus Christ our Lord, who taught His disciples, when praying, to say together:

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.
