Reader 1: On this second Sunday of Advent, we are warmed by the candle of peace.

Reader 2: As God's people, let us gather together in the light of peace where divisions dissolve and unity is established.

\*Affirmation of Faith

(adapted from the SALT Project)

As Christians, we believe in a God who creates all things: people, religions, languages, beauty, and every color in the rainbow.

As Christians, we believe in a God who becomes flesh, is born in a stable, a refugee with nowhere to lay his head. As Christians, we believe in a God who fills us with the courage to serve our fellow human beings, to feed the hungry, and to love the foreigner because we are descendants of the Israelites who were foreigners in the land of Egypt. This is who we are as Christians: people created to love, to welcome the stranger, and to walk, hand-in-hand with all God's people, through God's starry night and into the dawn.

Prayers of the People

Gracious God, because You are the Anointer of prophets and the Sender of our Savior, You continue to send Your messengers to proclaim Your word to us. As we persevere in preparing a way for You to enter our hearts, our lives, and our world, we ask that You would open our ears to hear Your voice calling us to repentance and righteousness, so that Your purifying power would refine us and reinforce us as Your people. Grant that Your liberating word would rescue us from all efforts to silence the life and love that You have, not just for us, but for all humanity. Through Your refiner's fire that burns in our souls and illumines our lives, remove from us any darkness that obscures Your truth...

and kindle within us a deeper faith, a greater hope, and a more unconditional love, so that we may be enlightened with new ways to serve You and reach out to our fellow human beings. Through the fuller's soap that You send among us, cleanse us of all selfish desires to care only for our needs or to absorb ourselves only in our indulgences, and instead immerse us once again in Your grace and mercy, so that as we remember the waters of baptism flowing over us, we may be inspired to participate with You in embracing all Your people and in cherishing the miraculous gift of creation that You have granted to us.

During the advent-ure through Advent, help us to discern how we could be more faithful in our preparations. Shape us, and reshape us, according to Your design, so that as we draw closer to You, You would transform any poverty of spirit into an abundance of faithfulness, and You would replace any neglect of the truth with a commitment to Your gospel. Help us to reflect the light of Your dawn which breaks upon us, so that all Your people may be more aware of Your holy intrusions... and lift us above the trivial trappings of desserts, delights, and decorations, so that we may ascend the true summit of this season, where we anticipate the day when there will be peace on earth, and where Your Son will be born once and for all in our hearts and in our homes... for we ask all these things in the name of Jesus Christ our Savior and our Lord, the One who taught us, when praying, to say together:

Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen.
