Beginning Sunday, September 21 and continuing for five weeks through October 19, we will be offering a special hymn class series following the Sunday morning service. This series is an invitation to explore the rich and diverse world of congregational song—from ancient origins to modern-day expressions. Each session will focus on a unique theme, combining listening, discussion, and reflection to deepen our appreciation of the hymns we sing and the ways they shape our worship and faith. Light refreshments will be provided, and all are welcome to attend—whether you are a lifelong hymn lover or just curious to learn more.

Throughout the five weeks, we'll examine how hymns have evolved through the centuries, how they express our deepest spiritual longings, and how they respond to the challenges of our contemporary world. Topics will include the history of hymnody, hymn texts addressing creation care, gender-inclusive language in song, and the impact of the digital age on congregational singing. These sessions will be informal, engaging, and open to a range of perspectives. Come be part of this meaningful conversation on the music that gives voice to our faith.

# TAIZE SERVICE

Join us on Wednesday, September 24 at 7:30 pm in the Sanctuary for a special candlelight Taizé service—an evening of gentle music, prayer, and quiet reflection. This service offers a peaceful and contemplative space in the middle of a busy week, where worshippers are invited to rest in the presence of God through stillness, silence, and song. The entire service will take place by candlelight, creating an atmosphere of calm and reverence as we gather in the chancel together as a community of prayer.

The Taizé style of worship comes from the ecumenical Taizé Community in the Burgundy region of France. Founded in 1940 by Brother Roger during the turmoil of World War II, Taizé began as a place of refuge for those fleeing the conflict—especially Jews. In the years that followed, it became an international center for reconciliation and spiritual renewal. Today, thousands of pilgrims—many of them young adults—travel each year to Taizé to take part in its simple rhythms of communal prayer, work, and silence. The community is widely known for its deep commitment to unity across Christian traditions and its focus on simplicity, peace, and justice.

Music is central to the Taizé tradition. The songs, often simple chants based on scripture or lines of prayer, are sung repeatedly to help move worshippers into a spirit of meditation. This repetition allows the music to become a form of prayer itself—quiet, reflective, and accessible to all, regardless of musical background. In our upcoming service, all of the music will be sung a cappella and led by a few of our choral scholars. Without the support of the organ, the music will have a pure and intimate beauty, echoing through the candlelit space with warmth and clarity.

This Taizé service is open to everyone, whether you are familiar with this tradition or simply seeking a space of calm and spiritual grounding. Come as you are. No expectations, no pressure—just an invitation to pause, breathe, listen, and pray together. We hope you will join us for this meaningful time of worship.


