

The regular meeting of Session was on Tuesday, February 25, 2025.

Average in-person attendance in December was 58; average YouTube viewings were 49. Westminster's Annual Statistical Report was submitted to Presbytery on February 13, 2025.

A proposal from Discipleship to offer an after-school program for WYDACA school-age children 2 days a week was discussed. It was received favorably; formal approval is pending working out some logistical details. Other church-wide events were noted; watch for details.

Personnel is working with Rev. Dr. Sandy Selby on a contract renewal; her current contract ends April 10.

Ed Labbe provided an update from the Pastoral Nominating Committee; they continue to review profiles and speak with prospective candidates.





# Amplified Youth facing POVERTY

The Amplified Youth had the opportunity to participate in a poverty simulation at Akron UMC this past month.

It was such a powerful experience! Each participant was put into a "family" and given a packet that included a bio for each family member and a few resources such as transportation passes, food vouchers, and money.

For just an hour, we were required to play the assigned role and try desperately to pay bills and go to work with our limited funds.

This was complicated even further by having to deal with age-related limitations, handicaps, children, and everyday challenges like having a car break down.

I was shocked that, just in the course of the short experience, all of us were feeling frustrated, and extremely stressed, and some people were even experiencing nausea.

This activity was so meaningful in helping us all develop a stronger sense of empathy for people who are forced to deal with these issues every day.

Poverty simulations play a really important role in helping us become kinder and more compassionate towards everyone.
