(Psalm 100:1)

In our worship service on June 8 we celebrated the feast of Pentecost, the day on which Christians recall the coming of the Holy Spirit to the early followers of Christ fifty days after his resurrection. During our service we celebrated the work of the Holy Spirit within our congregation by having Appreciation Day, acknowledging and thanking the people of our congregation who volunteer in more than thirty ministries of Westminster Presbyterian Church.

At the conclusion of our Pentecost service, the celebration continued! Members of our congregation, guests, and visitors gathered in Wright Herberich Hall, on the patio, and on the lawn, to have picnic lunch and listen to a Carillon concert by Director of Music/Organist Nik Stackpole. Nik played popular music selections ranging from ABBA's "Dancing Queen" to Louis Armstrong's "What a Wonderful World."

What a joy it was to hear the bells chiming in new and creative ways! In my sermon on Trinity Sunday, June 15, I said,

Christians have always lived in the tension between the conservative—grounding us in the tradition—and the creative—calling us to be open to our present context. In the 21st century that tension between the conservative and the creative is being lived out in new and challenging ways in our churches and in our civic life.

Nik's Carillon concert demonstrated how the tension between the conservative, in this case grounded in Westminster's long tradition of playing sacred music on the Carillon bells, and the creative, playing pop and movie music on those bells, could enliven a community that appreciated a creative and joyful presentation of music on bells that call us to worship, each Sunday.

It wasn't just people who were part of the community gathered to hear the Carillon! For most of the concert, a hawk was perched on the cross on the steeple of the church (he left, briefly, during "Climb Every Mountain," but returned for "Star Wars"). Several songbirds could be heard singing along with the Carillon throughout the concert.

Thank you, Nik, for hosting such a joyful and Spirit-filled occasion. Rumor has it that, due to popular demand, there will be another Carillon concert in the fall!

From the Desk of the Clerk of Session:

The regular meeting of Session was on Tuesday, May 27, 2025. Training for officers elected at the April 6 congregational meeting was held on May 18. New elders and deacons submitted statements of faith and answered the following questions:

- 1. What passage of scripture most shapes your vision of the mission of the Church and your role in it?
- 2. What will be your #1 priority as an officer of this congregation?
- 3. Can you answer all of the questions for ordination contained in the Book of Order confidently and affirmatively?
- 4. What does it mean to you to "submit joyfully to the Lordship of Jesus Christ in all aspects of life?"

All were accepted with ordination and installation scheduled was June 15.

Rev. Barry Chance led a discussion on committee structure. He noted some overlap in the types of work performed by committees. Out of an estimated 65 active worship attendees, 34 currently serve on committees some on multiple committees. This does not count task forces such as the Celtic Garden. Current committee responsibilities are not always clearly defined.

Barry explained that churches have often had a "silo" committee structure, e.g., Human Resources, Finance, Operations, etc. This has at times led to competitiveness between committees. Another option is Planning (visioning), Operations (execute plan) and Evaluation (how did it work). Task forces can perform designated tasks for a set period of time. He suggested establishing a task force of 2 elders and 2 deacons to develop a proposed structure for going forward. Discussion will be continued at the June meeting.

Preliminary unaudited data for 2025 through April shows actual revenues \$182,152; budgeted \$166,643. Actual expenses \$181,014; budgeted \$213,571. Net (actual revenues less actual expenses) is a surplus of \$5,138. Endowment distributions and interest were above budget; contributions were below budget. Personnel expenses were below budget. Expenses need to be monitored since contributions tend to decrease over the summer months.

Average worship attendance for April was 81, including 131 on Easter Sunday. Average viewings on YouTube for April were 63 (YouTube Live = 90).
