Session – September 2025

The regular meeting of Session was on Tuesday, September 23, 2025.

On behalf of the Pastoral Nominating Committee (PNC), Ed Labbe reported that a candidate has provisionally accepted an offer to serve as pastor of Westminster.

The offer is within the constraints approved by Session in July 2024. The candidate is scheduled to deliver the candidate's sermon on Sunday, October 26.

The candidate's name will not be announced until the week before the candidate's sermon, included in a letter to the congregation. A motion prevailed to call for a special congregational meeting immediately following the worship service on October 26, 2025.

The first purpose is to vote on calling the candidate to serve as pastor of Westminster Presbyterian Church, with a start date of January 5, 2026. The other item is to formally elect Kate Huisinga to serve on the church-wide Nominating Committee.

September 28 was Reverend Dr. Sandy Selby's last Sunday as Bridge Pastor. She noted she has enjoyed serving and will be serving as pulpit supply some Sundays this fall, and pastoral care as available and needed. Pulpit supply will be used from October 5, 2025 through January 4, 2026.

Preliminary unaudited data for 2025 through August shows a deficit of \$14,033. Endowment distributions, interest and contributions were above budget. Finance and Personnel expenses were below budget, with Personnel reflecting pay for a full-time pastor.

Committee reports noted several upcoming activities.

Kudos to every one of them!












